Powder Passport makes your day of skiing or riding as easy as 1-2-FREE!



1. Use this guidebook to find the list of participating mountains.
2. Follow the special instructions and present your Powder Passport at the specified location.
3. Enjoy your day of skiing or snowboarding. No Blackout Dates!

Important Details:

This card is non-transferable and non-refundable. Offers and admissions may be redeemed at one mountain per day. The Powder Passport is activated the first time you use it for admission to a participating mountain. Once activated it is then valid for the number of calendar days you have purchased, over the course of the season (November 15, 2006 – April 30, 2007). Special offers are valid for the duration of your card and will not activate your card unless otherwise noted. Powder Passport offers are not valid in conjunction with other offers or promotions. Powder Passport is not transferable for "credits" toward products not offered in this guide. Lift tickets and lessons must be redeemed at the time of service. The Powder Passport may NOT be redeemed at any mountain in return for a ticket to visit the mountain on a future date.

How to use your guide

This guidebook provides important information for you to refer to when planning your day of skiing or riding. We recommend that you spend some time planning your excursion by using this guidebook as a reference.

- Powder Passport is valid only at the participating mountains and lodging noted in this Guidebook.
- Use the Powder Passport Guidebook as a reference, not only for mountain statistics, but also for a bird's eye view of the mountain.
- Each mountain has special instructions for redeeming your Powder Passport. Please refer to each mountain's page to find out where to go to redeem your free lift ticket or offer.
- Some mountains offer special lodging, shopping deals, or free lessons. Refer to each mountain's page to see the special offer included with your Powder Passport.
- The Guidebook is organized by state. Each state has a color coding – see below.
